## GRAB AND GO FOR ADULTS

## EASTER EGG WREATH



## Supplies

- Plastic Easter Eggs/standard size (Depending on the size of the wreath ring, it takes 1 egg per inch to fill wreath, for instance, 9 " ring requires 9 eggs)
- Two wire wreath rings
- Ribbon
- Yarn
- Other decorations of your choice. Such as Easter grass, moss, greenery. Other fasteners such as floral wire or zip ties (optional)

There are plenty of ways to paint or decorate plastic eggs. If you'd like to do so, Google "Decorating plastic eggs" and have fun choosing your design. We chose not to paint or decorate our eggs.

You can also embellish the wreath in many ways, again by Googling "Easter Wreathes" and looking at some details to find what you like!

If you painted or decorated your eggs, make sure they are fully dry before assembling.

## How to Assemble Your Wreath

Lay one wreath ring flat on your work surface. Arrange the eggs on the wreath ring. You could also add embellishments such as Easter grass, moss, greenery to cushion the eggs. If your plastic eggs pop open easily you may want to glue them together. Then top with the second wreath ring.

Fasten the two wreaths together by wrapping yarn around them. You could also use floral wire or zip ties. Basically you are trying to create a wreath cage. Securing the eggs is important, at the least, the wire on four sides ... top, bottom, left and right. The more places you secure it, the sturdier it will be.
